



Year 4 Curriculum Map

Summer 1 2024 - 2025

English

After finishing our story openings unit, we will read and analyse the story 'The Mousehole Cat', looking at the structure and characters in the story and using the plot as a basis for writing our own story. In grammar we will be learning about paragraphs, different tenses and similes for description.

Maths

We will finish our unit on statistics where we will look at line graphs and learn how to read them correctly before going on to present data in a line graph and interpret that data. We will then come back to looking at place value, addition and subtraction. We will then recap and improve our knowledge and ability in measuring.

RE

Our next unit of learning will be 'Are all churches the same?'. Christianity is a world-wide religion and the variety of churches and types of worship reflect that. We will be comparing and studying churches around the world and in our local community.

Science

Our topic this half term is 'Teeth and Digestion'. We will be learning about the different types of teeth in our mouth, the job they do and how to look after our teeth. Then we will learn about the different organs that make up our digestive system and what happens to food that we eat.

History

We will be continuing to learn about an aspect of 'Ancient Greece'. We will be focusing on Ancient Greek democracy, looking at how it was governed and particularly comparing the city-states of Athens and Sparta.

Art

We will go onto learn about the sculptor Dale Chihuly and look at some of the pieces he has created before creating our own piece of sculpture in his style.

Computing

After finishing our animation unit, we will be looking at the different pieces of hardware involved in computers and what their function is.

PSHE

We will look at the theme of Health and Well-Being, discussing maintaining a balanced lifestyle; oral hygiene, personal identity; mental wellbeing, medicines and household products.

PE

In PE children we will be learning about Striking and Fielding Games - Cricket. We will also have some visitors in each Thursday morning leading 'Healthy Heads' sessions for us.
