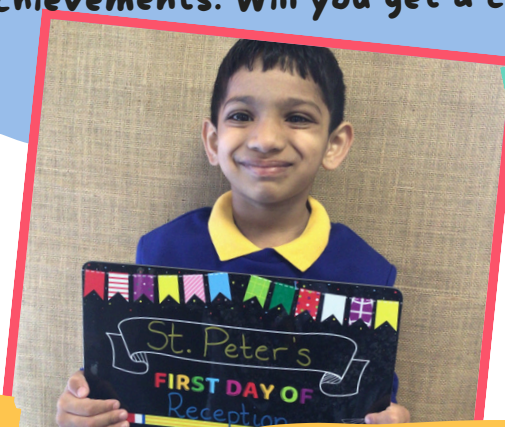
## Our St Peter's Promise
