FREE SCHOOL MEALS...

We would like to make you aware of updated guidance which means that more families may now be eligible for Free School Meals.

We encourage all families to check whether they qualify and submit an application if eligible. Free School Meals help reduce household costs and ensure children have access to a healthy meal each school day.

In addition, every successful application brings extra funding to the school, helping us provide additional resources, interventions and opportunities for all pupils.

Even if your child already receives a free meal through the Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme, we would still encourage eligible families to apply, as this can secure additional funding for the school.
